I am pleased to be writing in support of the National Institute of Justice (NIJ) funded project, *Responding to Sexual Assault on Campus: A National Assessment and Systematic Classification of the Scope and Challenges for Investigation and Adjudication*, on behalf of the Campus Prevention Network (CPN). The CPN supports colleges and universities in driving lasting, large-scale change on critical health and safety issues, including the prevention of sexual assault. The goals of your project to provide helpful information and tools to improve understanding of current practices in campus investigations and adjudications of student-on-student sexual assault cases aligns with the CPN's commitment to share best practices that promote the highest standards of prevention.

We hope that individuals who are invited to take part in your confidential stakeholder interviews will participate and share their important perspective.

We look forward to your findings and the tools for campuses that will be produced as a part of the project, including a policy checklist (guided by federal legal requirements), guidance for conducting a website self-evaluation, and a digest of investigation and adjudication approaches including highlights of the strengths and complexities of each approach. These tools can be critical in providing support to schools as they work to improve their response to sexual assault, and we look forward to reviewing them.
